## Minutes of the 66<sup>th</sup> Meeting of State level Environment Impact Assessment Authority, Jharkhand, held on 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2019.

The 66<sup>th</sup> meeting of the State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) was convened on 22/01/2019 in the office of SEIAA, Ranchi. The meeting was chaired by Shri S.E.H. Kazmi, Chairman, SEIAA, Jharkhand. The attendance in the meeting was as follows:-

## The decisions taken in the 66th SEIAA meeting are as follows:-

The Authority reviewed the proceeding of the 65th meeting of SEAC held on  $07^{th}-09^{th}$  January, 2019 in the light of minutes of the meeting of Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC) and found that the consolidation of the following points from an environment perspective would be consistent:-

- 1. The geographical coordinates of the project area as per survey of India Topo sheet.
- 2. Geo- Mining parameter of mine, if applicable.
- 3. Details of court cases and the compliance status, if any.
- 4. Details of water bodies, impact on drainage, if any.
- 5. If a joint venture the names and address of the JV partners including their share.
- 6. If the project involves diversion of forest land.
- 7. If the project involves the National Board of Wild Life Clearance.
- 8. If the project falls within 10km of Eco-Sensitive Zone and No Mining Zone Area.
- 9. If any, statuary clearance required.

Hence after full deliberations and discussions, the authority decided to ask to SEAC, Jharkhand to be incorporate the above mentioned points from the project wise environmental perspective in the proceeding of the upcoming meeting. So that, all the information related to the projects can be clearly reflected.

It was decided to grant ToR to the above mentioned project proposals with the conditions recommended by SEAC. SEAC has also recommended that the State Govt. / SPCB to take legal and administrative action against the project proponent under the provision of section 19 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Hence authority decided unanimously to accept the recommendation made by SEAC in above mentioned project proposals.

- b) Form-1M be made More comprehensive for areas of 0 to 5 Ha by dispensing with the requirement for public consultation to be evaluated by SEAC for recommendation of grant of EC by SEIAA instead of DEIAA/DEAC;
- c) If a cluster or an individual lease size exceeds 5 ha the EIA/EMP be made applicable in the process of grant of prior Environmental Clearance.
- d) EIA and /or EMP be prepared for the entire cluster in terms of recommendations 5 (supra) of the guidelines for the purpose of recommendations 6, 7 and 8 thereof;
- e) Revise the procedure to also incorporate procedure with respect to annual rate of replenishment and time frame for replenishment after mining closure in an area:

SEIAA has taken the decision that PP will have to get the Circle Officer certificate of proposed area stating that applied area has not been recorded as "jungal jhari" in khatiyan part - 2 or any government records and PP has also to submit the attested photocopy of khatiyan part - 2 by concerned Circle Officer on or before issuance of final EC.
